Date of Visit: 28th February 2026

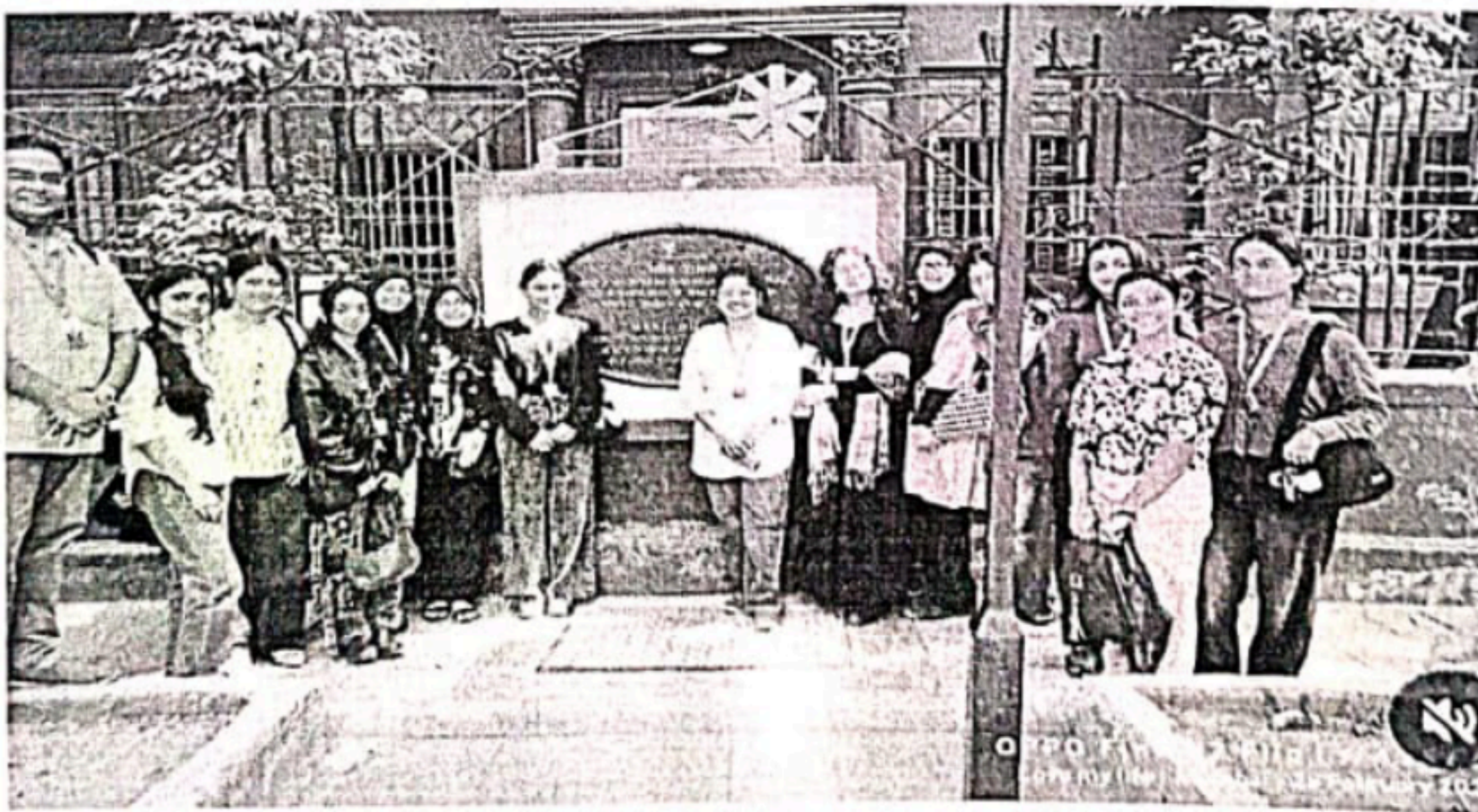
